Present were Mr. Pond, Mr. Lurvey and Mr. Barnes. Also present were Mr. Strain, Mrs. Kay, Mr. Bowman and Mr. Wise. Absent were Mr. Ela and Mr. Hawkins. Mr. Strain acted as presiding officer.

The Minutes of the meeting of December 15, 1971, were read and approved as amended.

Mrs. Kay presented the financial statement of the District as of December 31, 1971, as follows:

Mrs. Kay presented the current bills for payment in the amount of \$5,499.51. Mr. Barnes moved, Mr. Pond seconded and a motion to pay the bills was carried.

Mr. Strain reported that Mr. Tucker's office had furnished an audit to the proper State officials. There was some discussion as to the allocation of mileage expenses and the omission of the adjusted budget items which had been changed by resolution passed at the meeting of October 20, 1971. Mr. Wise was instructed to look into the matter.

There was a discussion of Mr. Strain's suggestion that all persons wishing to purchase water meters should make full payment before the water meter was installed in order to prevent the necessity of charging interest. The Board instructed Mr. Strain to make a formal proposal in this matter at the next meeting.

There was a discussion of the criteria which should be used to determine over what ground the District should extend its pipes in order to supply water to potential users. It was felt that a requirement that there be a dedicated road might have to be changed. There was also question of the effect upon the District's maintenance when a dedicated road was vacated.

There was a discussion of salary increases but a decision was postponed until the next regular meeting.

Mr. Strain stated that he felt that the office needed an addressogram machine and that he had been investigating prices and the availability of the machines. The Board instructed him to continue his investigation of the matter so that he could later make a recommendation.

Mr. Strain reported that the orifice plate problem had still not been resolved. The Board instructed Mr. Wise to put pressure on the engineers and suplier to attempt to resolve the problem before springtime.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at $9:10\ P.\ M.$

The Minutes of the meeting of January 19, 1972, were read and approved.

Mrs. Kay presented the financial statement of the District as of January 31, 1972, as follows:

Mrs. Kay presented the current bills for payment in the amount of \$3,619.04. Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Lurvey seconded and a motion to pay the bills was carried.

The Board then approved the purchase of an Addressograph Machine for \$800.00 from the Mesa County Teacher's Federal Credit Union.

Mr. Schuster reported that he is employed by Thompson Pipe and Steel, and that he would be interested to have the Clifton Water District joint the American Water Works Association. He explained that the Association is made up of suppliers, engineers, cities, districts and other organizations and persons interested in water distribution. He reported that the dues are \$50.00 per year for which the member receives various publications, public relations aids, and other advantages. The Board asked that Mr. Schuster supply the pertinent information to Mr. Strain for his evaluation. Mr. Schuster then left the meeting.

Mr. Strain reported that there is presently \$12,000.00 outstanding on installment payments for the installation of meters. The Board discussed the nature of new construction within the boundaries of the District, and the general economic status of people wishing to purchase water meters. Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Hawkins seconded and a motion to require all meter installation bills to be paid upon installation was carried. The Board determined that the new policy would go into effect at 12:00 o'clock Noon February 17, 1972.

Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Hawkins seconded and a motion to instruct Mr. Wise to investigate a purchase of Treasury Bills to mature in August was carried.

At this time, Mr. Stan Funk of Goble-Sampson Company and Bob Ross of Ross Valve Company arrived at the meeting. Mr. Funk reported that the Ross Valve was not accurately functioning and that he and Mr. Ross and Mr. Brauer were attempting to solve the problem. He stated that there could be a number of problems

which have made the valve inoperative. Mr. Brauer said that one of the problems was the wide range of pressure in the City's waterlines which make it very difficult for any valve to operate properly. Mr. Funk, Mr. Ross and Mr. Brauer stated that they would continue to work on the problem, and at this time left the meeting.

The Board instructed Mr. Wise to write a letter to the people who had recently had their land included in the District and inform those people who owed taxes to the District the extent of their debt and ask them to contact the District's office for means of payment.

Mr. Hawkins moved, Mr. Lurvey seconded and a Motion to raise the salaries of Mrs. Kay, Mr. Strain and Mrg. Bowman 5% effective February 1, 1972, and to raise Mrs. Weaver's wages to \$2.00 an hour was carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.

Mrs. Kay presented the financial statement of the District as of February 29, 1972, as follows:

Mrs. Kay presented the current bills for payment in the amount of \$4,470.13. Mr. Barnes moved, Mr. Pond seconded and a motion to pay the bills was carried.

Mrs. Kay then presented the bill of Nelson, Haley, Patterson and Quirk for \$175.72. Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Hawkins seconded and a motion not to pay this bill until explained by Mr. Brauer was carried. Mr. Strain was instructed to inform Mr. Brauer that the bill would not be paid until he appeared at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors to discuss it.

Mr. Strain reported that the Ross valve was now adequately functioning and that he recommended the Board accept Water Works Improvement - Schedule No. 2, Leon Parkerson, contractor, as completed. Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Barnes seconded and a motion to pay the retainage as soon as publication was completed was carried.

Mr. Ela reported that it would be better for the District to invest in six month saving certificates rather than treasury bills because of the higher yield of the certificates of deposit. He also reported that he had deposited \$15,000.00 in the Palisades National Bank and \$15,000.00 in the First National Bank in six month certificates of deposit. Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Barnes seconded and a motion to adopt and ratify the investment as set forth by Mr. Ela was carried.

Mr. Strain reported that it would soon be necessary to construct new filters which would also require additional pumps. The Board instructed Mr. Strain to begin his investigation as to the manner and schedule by which such filters should be planned and constructed. Mr. Pond expressed the opinion that if the District was continually enjoying a profit that at some point the savings should be passed on to the users or to those who pay the mill levy. The Board concurred in this view with the reservation that in order to adequately serve the area funds must be available for needed additional construction. Expenditures for the new filter installations and extension of the distribution system were presented as projects for which funds would be needed shortly.

Mr. Strain reported that he spoke with a representative of the Housing and Urban Development Department of the Federal Government about the possibility of obtaining Federal money. He further reported that it would be necessary to have the District connected in some fashion with an incorporated municipality in order to have access to Federal money. He pointed out that Clifton is not an incorporated municipality. The Board expressed reluctance to accept Federal funds because of problems of bureaucracy, excessive Federal restrictions and controls, and the necessity to incorporate the Town of Clifton in order to receive such funds.

Mr. Strain reported that the rate schedule for water users may have to be adjusted because some users are not paying the cost of the water supplied to them. He stated that he would complete an investigation of this problem and make recommendations at a later time.

 $\mbox{Mr.}$ Strain discussed the problems of recurrent vandalism at the District's installations.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 P. M.

The Minutes of the meeting of March 15, 1972, were read and approved.

Mrs. Kay presented the financial statement of the District as of March 31, 1972, as follows:

Mrs. Kay presented the current bills for payment in the amount of \$4,900.91. Mr. Barnes moved, Mr. Hawkins seconded and a motion to pay the bills was carried. Mr. Pond moved, Mr. Hawkins seconded and a motion to transfer \$30,000.00 from the General Account to pass book savings was carried. Mr. Wise was instructed to investigate the safest place to put the funds in view of depositor's insurance considerations. He was further instructed to take those actions necessary to prepare for the transfer.

Mr. Strain stated that it would be cheaper to change the method in which electricity is purchased from Public Service. The Board agreed that such a change would be beneficial because the district would pay less on a yearly basis although more than they are presently paying in some particular months.

Mr. Strain presented to the Board the problem of requiring subdividers to pay for all of meter installations within the subdivision at the time streets are paved and main water lines are installed but before individual lots are built or sold. The Board thought that a modification of policy to meet these circumstances may have to be considered in the future.

At this point Mr. Brauer arrived at the meeting and after recalculating the bill stated that Nelson, Haley, Patterson & Quirk owes the District \$346.78, which he said would be paid. Mr. Brauer further stated that his firm would take care of the excess telephone cable.

Mr. Strain reported that 230 taps were projected for installation this year. He also presented a chart, a copy of which is attached to these Minutes showing a rather dramatic increase in the use of water in the early months of the present year. He stated that a large amount of water had been used by Corn Construction Company but that it was still time to consider the installation of new filters. He further reported that the present filters can filter approximately 750,000 gallons per day when pushed to their ultimate

capacity, but that the rated capacity is somewhat lower.

Mr. Brauer informed the Board that if two new filters were put into operation the capacity would be 1.26 million gallons per day, which should be sufficient to handle the projected need up to the year 1989. One new filter would increase the rate of capacity to 1.019 million gallons per day.

Mr. Pond stated that he felt there was no point in making additional plans until the District discussed with the City whether an additional 250,000 gallons per day could be provided by the City. The Board consurred with Mr. Pond and instructed Mr. Pond to meet with Mr. Wise, Mr. Strain, Mr. Brauer and City Officials to discuss the possibility of the District purchasing more water.

There was discussion as to whether the Board members should pay themselves a Director's fee for attendance at the meegings. No action was taken by the Board in this regard.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 9:55 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President, William Ela. Other members present were John Hawkins, William Barnes and Lehman Pond. Also present were Mrs. Kay, Robert Gerlofs, Charles Strain and Robert Strain.

Current bills in the amount of \$6,059.82 were approved for payment.

The monthly report of operations shows a net profit in July of \$8994.59, bringing the total for the year to \$60,822.83.

Mr. Gerlofs was present to present to the board his recommendations relative to increasing filtering capicity. The current cost estimate for Estimete "D" using two 236 gpm filters is \$27,000. Alternate of one 410 gpm filter is as follows:

Additional costs will include approximately 20% for engineering, legal, fiscal, etc. He also stated the need for one additional pump at the intake and reorginizing the wiring panel at the filter plant at approximately \$5,500.

Mr. Pond made the motion that Mr. Gerlofs be instructed to core drill and do prelimenary engineering for construction of a 410 gpm unit with construction to be completed before February 1, 1973. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hawkins and carried. Mr. Gerlofs suggested he would check to see if the old contract is still in force, though the Board is free to negotiate for a new one if they desire. Charles Strain noted the foundation of the present structure is sinking. The Board feels this repair should be coordinated with the new construction and Mr. Strain was instructed to take such steps as are necessary.

The Board discussed charges being made to Sanitation District #1 for collections. The present charge is 10% of collections for sewer service and a flat \$5 charge for new taps. The members agreed that some changes must be made and asked Robert Strain to discuss with his board at least \$200 a month as a fair charge.

The proposed budget for 1972-73 was discussed. On a motion by Lehman Pond, seconded by W William Barnes, the proposed budget was approved. The budget will be formally accepted at the September meeting after notice is properly published.

WHEREAS, a contingency has arisen due to the budget for the current year allowing only \$55,000 for principal payment on bonds outstanding when the payment was actually \$60,000, and due to the greatly increased revenues from sale of water, which were not and could not have been forseen at the time of adoption of the 1972 budget

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the 1972 budget for the Clifton Water District which was adopted September 15, 1971, be amended in the following particulars:

- (a) the amount of estimated expenditures for retiring bonds be changed from \$53,000 to \$60,000.
- (b) that the amount estimated for contingency be changed from \$2,000 to \$7,000
- (c) that the amount of estimated revenue from sale of water be increased from \$130,000 to \$140,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby appropriated from the current earnings of the District, and time deposits of the District, a sufficient sum to pay such additional costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be furnished to the Division of Local Government in the Department of Local Affairs,

Mr. John Hornbecker, representing Permitt, presented his proposal for a 410 G.P.M. Filter. The figure was \$17,190 against \$13,500 engineer estimate. Hr. Hornbaker stated that if he could contract with Grand Junction Steel Fabricating Co., there would be a savings of \$850 freight, also if the cover was eliminated, this would be a savings.

Mr. Gerloffs was instructed to check with Mr. Facetti of the Colorado Department of Public Health about the cover, and to proceed with a letter of intent to Mr. Hornbaker. He also was instructed to finalize total cost figures prior to our thirty day limit on acceptance of Mr. Hornbecker's price quote.

Charles Strain stated the need for a chemical to kill weeds from such places as fire hydrants and that the substance he plans to use runs \$841 for 50 gallons. He was instructed to keep the Board posted, but to proceed as he feels it necessary.

The meeting adjourned at 9:10 p.m.

Held on November 15, 1972 at Clifton, Colorado at 7:30 P.M.

Present were William, Ela, Ray Lurvey, Lehman Pond and John Hawkins. Also present were Laveta Kay, Charles Strain, Hugh Wise and Gordon Bruckner.

Minutes of the meeting of October 18 were approved as submitted.

Mrs. Kay presented current bills in the amount of \$4,849.16. Mr. Hawkins moved, Mr. Lurvey seconded and a motion to pay the current bills carried.

Mr. Bruckner stated that soil testing and analyzing had been completed and in his professional opinion, the base under the building will support the new filter.

Mr. Pend made a motion to contract with Nelson, Haley, Patterson & Quirk, Inc. to work on an hourly basis, not to exceed the curve. The soil testing, which has already been completed, to be excluded. Mr. Hawkins seconded the motion which duly carried. Mr. Wise was instructed to draw the contract.

Mr. Lurvey made a motion that we accept the bid proposal from Permutit of \$17,790 for the 410 G.P.M. filter, less \$550 and eliminate the cover, for a total of \$17,240, delivery to be made by January 15, 1973. Also, that we ask for bids for the installation and related items on the filter. Bids to be opened on December 13, 1972. Mr. Hawkins seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Strain noted that the balance in our checking account as of October 31 was \$26,467.92 and suggested transferring some of the money to a savings account where it would draw interest until needed. The board concurred and Mr. Strain was instructed to see that the transfer of at least \$20,000 be made.

Mr. Pend moved that the regular meeting of the Board for December be moved up one week and held on December 13. At this time the bids are to be opened for installation of the filter. The motion was duly seconded and carried.

On a motion by Mr. Barnes, seconded by Mr. Hawkins, bills in the amount of \$4772.72 were approved for payment.

Mr. Barnes made a motion that each of the employees and members of the board of Directors of the Water District be given a turkey for Christmas. The District to pay up to seventeen pounds, and the turkeys to be purchased from Clifton Thriftway. The metien was seconded by Mr. Hawkins and passed.

At this point William Ela entered the meeting and took the chair.

Hugh Wise reported that proper publication and preliminary work had been completed and it was in order for the Board to take bids for a 500 G.P.M. pump, piping and related materials, plus labor.

Scheirman Construction Company, Inc. of Montrose presented a bid bond for 5% of the total and presented the following bid:

J.D. Lunsford Plumbing and Heating Company of Grand Junction also had a 5% bid bond and the following bid:

Schedule #1 19,068.00 Schedule #2 1,710.00 Total Bid 20,778.00

Lehman Pond made a motion that the bid of J.D. Lunsford be accepted subject to approval of Bob Gerloffs. Mr. Gerloffs was asked to make a decision within a week. The metion was duly seconded and passed.

Hugh Wise presented a contract with Nelson, Haley, Patterson & Quirk, Inc. The engineering firm is to be paid on an hourly basis, not to exceed the curve.

The City of Grand Junction has made a tentative offer of ly million gallons per deliche (40¢ per thousand for the excess with the provision that thay do not deliver in excess of one million per day in case of a water shortage. Charles Strain, William Ela and Bob Gerloffs are to meeti with the city council prepared to make a counter proposal of 27¢ to 30¢.

William Ela neted that 8% of the tax base to Ute Concervancy District is being paid by tax payers of Clifton Water District and suggested it might be possible to negotiate with them in the future.

The President declared the meeting adjourned.
